

REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MR. SPEAKER AND MR. PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1353: Budget process; bring forward various sections relating to.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

76 **SECTION 1.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
77 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Eighty-five Million Five
78 Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$85,570,000.00) from the Capital
79 Expense Fund created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of
80 1972, to the 2022 IHL Capital Improvements Fund created in Section
81 20 of this act.

82 **SECTION 2.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
83 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Thirty-five Million
84 Dollars (\$35,000,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund created in
85 Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to the 2022
86 Community and Junior Colleges Capital Improvements Fund created in
87 Section 21 of this act.

88 **SECTION 3.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
89 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Thirty-five Million Two

90 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$35,250,000.00) from the Capital
91 Expense Fund created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of
92 1972, to the 2022 State Agencies Capital Improvements Fund created
93 in Section 22 of this act.

94 **SECTION 4.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
95 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Ten Million Dollars
96 (\$10,000,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund created in Section
97 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to the 2022 Department of
98 Finance and Administration Statewide Repair and Renovation Fund
99 created in Section 23 of this act.

100 **SECTION 5.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
101 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Four Million Four Hundred
102 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$4,450,000.00) from the Capital Expense
103 Fund created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to
104 the Local Governments and Rural Water Systems Improvements
105 Revolving Loan Fund created in Section 41-3-16, Mississippi Code
106 of 1972.

107 **SECTION 6.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
108 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Five Million Dollars
109 (\$5,000,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund created in Section
110 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to the Mississippi Community
111 Heritage Preservation Grant Fund created in Section 39-5-145,
112 Mississippi Code of 1972.

113 **SECTION 7.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
114 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Four Million Four Hundred

115 Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$4,490,000.00) from the Capital Expense
116 Fund created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to
117 the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund created in Section
118 49-17-85, Mississippi Code of 1972, to provide funds necessary to
119 match projected federal funds available through the following
120 federal fiscal year from the annual Clean Water State Revolving
121 Fund (CWSRF) appropriations and from the supplemental
122 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) appropriations. Not
123 more than Two Million Eight Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars
124 (\$2,870,000.00) of such funds may be used to match the annual
125 CWSRF appropriations and not more than One Million Six Hundred
126 Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$1,620,000.00) of such funds may be
127 issued to match the supplemental IIJA appropriations.

128 **SECTION 8.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
129 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Two Million Dollars
130 (\$2,000,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund created in Section
131 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to the Mississippi Dam
132 Safety Fund created in Section 19, Chapter 492, Laws of 2020.

133 **SECTION 9.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
134 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of One Million Five Hundred
135 Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund
136 created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to the
137 2022 Tate County - Erosion Control and Repair Fund created in
138 Section 24 of this act.

139 **SECTION 10.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
140 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Thirty Million Dollars
141 (\$30,000,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund created in Section
142 27-103-303, to the ACE Fund created in Section 57-1-16,
143 Mississippi Code of 1972.

144 **SECTION 11.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
145 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Forty Million Dollars
146 (\$40,000,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund created in Section
147 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to the Mississippi Site
148 Development Grant Fund created in Section 57-1-701, Mississippi
149 Code of 1972.

150 **SECTION 12.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
151 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Ten Million Dollars
152 (\$10,000,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund created in Section
153 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to Mississippi Business
154 Investment Fund created in Section 57-61-21, Mississippi Code of
155 1972, to be used for the purposes provided in Section 57-61-36(3),
156 Mississippi Code of 1972.

157 **SECTION 13.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
158 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Three Million Dollars
159 (\$3,000,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund created in Section
160 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to the Mississippi Major
161 Economic Impact Authority Fund created in Section 57-75-15,
162 Mississippi Code of 1972, to be used for projects defined in
163 Section 57-75-5(f)(ii), Mississippi Code of 1972.

164 **SECTION 14.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
165 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Seven Million Dollars
166 (\$7,000,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund created in Section
167 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to the Economic Development
168 Highway Fund created in Section 65-4-15, Mississippi Code of 1972.

169 **SECTION 15.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
170 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Ten Million Dollars
171 (\$10,000,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund created in Section
172 27-103,303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to the Mississippi Industry
173 Incentive Financing Revolving Fund created in Section 57-1-221,
174 Mississippi Code of 1972.

175 **SECTION 16.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
176 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Five Million Dollars
177 (\$5,000,000.00) from the Capital Expense Fund created in Section
178 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to the Mississippi Main
179 Street Investment Grant Fund created in Section 57-1-601,
180 Mississippi Code of 1972.

181 **SECTION 17.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
182 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Two Hundred One Million
183 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$201,500,000.00) from the Capital
184 Expense Fund created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of
185 1972, to the 2022 Local Improvements Projects Fund created in
186 Section 25 of this act.

187 **SECTION 18.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
188 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Twenty Million Eight

189 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$20,800,000.00) from the State BP
190 Settlement Fund created in Section 27-103-302.1, Mississippi Code
191 of 1972, to the 2022 Local Improvements Projects Fund created in
192 Section 25 of this act.

193 **SECTION 19.** Upon the effective date of this act, the State
194 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the sum of Seven Million Five
195 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$7,500,000.00) from the Capital Expense
196 Fund created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, to
197 the special fund created in Section 26 of this act.

198 **SECTION 20.** (a) (i) A special fund, to be designated as
199 the "2022 IHL Capital Improvements Fund," is created within the
200 State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained by the State
201 Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart from
202 the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining in
203 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the
204 State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment earnings
205 on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into such fund.

206 (ii) Monies deposited into the fund shall be
207 disbursed, in the discretion of the Department of Finance and
208 Administration, with the approval of the Board of Trustees of
209 State Institutions of Higher Learning on those projects related to
210 the universities under its management and control to pay the costs
211 of capital improvements, renovation and/or repair of existing
212 facilities, furnishings and/or equipping facilities for public
213 facilities as hereinafter described:

309 (b) (i) Amounts deposited into such special fund shall
 310 be disbursed to pay the costs of projects described in paragraph
 311 (a) of this section. If any monies in such special fund are not
 312 used within four (4) years after the date funds are transferred
 313 under Section 1 of this act from the Capital Expense Fund created

314 in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, into the special
315 fund, then the institution of higher learning for which any unused
316 monies are allocated under paragraph (a) of this section shall
317 provide an accounting of such unused monies to the Department of
318 Finance and Administration.

319 (ii) Monies in the special fund may be used to
320 reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred by the
321 Department of Finance and Administration, acting through the
322 Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property Management, in
323 administering or providing assistance directly related to a
324 project described in paragraph (a) of this section. An accounting
325 of actual costs incurred for which reimbursement is sought shall
326 be maintained for each project by the Department of Finance and
327 Administration, Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property
328 Management. Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary
329 costs for a project shall not exceed two percent (2%) of the
330 monies in the special fund used for such project. Monies
331 authorized for a particular project may not be used to reimburse
332 administrative costs for unrelated projects.

333 (c) The Department of Finance and Administration,
334 acting through the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property
335 Management, is expressly authorized and empowered to receive and
336 expend any local or other source funds in connection with the
337 expenditure of funds provided for in this section. The
338 expenditure of monies deposited into the special fund shall be

339 under the direction of the Department of Finance and
340 Administration, and such funds shall be paid by the State
341 Treasurer upon warrants issued by such department, which warrants
342 shall be issued upon requisitions signed by the Executive Director
343 of the Department of Finance and Administration, or his designee.

344 (d) Any amounts allocated to an institution of higher
345 learning that are in excess of that needed to complete the
346 projects at such institution of higher learning that are described
347 in paragraph (a) of this section may be used for general repairs
348 and renovations at the institution of higher learning.

349 **SECTION 21.** (a) (i) A special fund, to be designated as
350 the "2022 Community and Junior Colleges Capital Improvements
351 Fund," is created within the State Treasury. The fund shall be
352 maintained by the State Treasurer as a separate and special fund,
353 separate and apart from the General Fund of the state. Unexpended
354 amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall
355 not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned or
356 investment earnings on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into
357 such fund. Monies in the fund may not be used or expended for any
358 purpose except as authorized under this section.

359 (ii) Monies deposited into the fund shall be
360 disbursed, in the discretion of the Department of Finance and
361 Administration, to pay the costs of acquisition of real property,
362 construction of new facilities, equipping and furnishing
363 facilities, including furniture and technology equipment and

364 infrastructure, and addition to or renovation of existing
365 facilities for community and junior college campuses as
366 recommended by the Mississippi Community College Board. The
367 amount to be expended at each community and junior college is as
368 follows:

385 (b) Amounts deposited into such special fund shall be
386 disbursed to pay the costs of projects described in paragraph (a)
387 of this section. If any monies in such special fund are not used
388 within four (4) years after the date funds are transferred under

389 Section 2 of this act from the Capital Expense Fund created in
390 Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, into the special
391 fund, then the community college or junior college for which any
392 such monies are allocated under paragraph (a) of this section
393 shall provide an accounting of such unused monies to the
394 Department of Finance and Administration.

395 (c) The Department of Finance and Administration,
396 acting through the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property
397 Management, is expressly authorized and empowered to receive and
398 expend any local or other source funds in connection with the
399 expenditure of funds provided for in this section. The
400 expenditure of monies deposited into the special fund shall be
401 under the direction of the Department of Finance and
402 Administration, and such funds shall be paid by the State
403 Treasurer upon warrants issued by such department, which warrants
404 shall be issued upon requisitions signed by the Executive Director
405 of the Department of Finance and Administration, or his designee.

406 **SECTION 22.** (a) (i) A special fund, to be designated as
407 the "2022 State Agencies Capital Improvements Fund," is created
408 within the State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained by the
409 State Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart
410 from the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining
411 in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the
412 State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment earnings
413 on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into such fund.

414 (ii) Monies deposited into the fund shall be
415 disbursed, in the discretion of the Department of Finance and
416 Administration, to pay the costs of capital improvements,
417 renovation and/or repair of existing facilities, furnishings
418 and/or equipping facilities for public facilities as hereinafter
419 described:

470 (b) (i) Amounts deposited into such special fund shall
 471 be disbursed to pay the costs of projects described in paragraph
 472 (a) of this section. If any monies in such special fund are not
 473 used within four (4) years after the date funds are transferred
 474 under Section 3 of this act from the Capital Expense Fund created
 475 in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, into the special
 476 fund, then the agency for which any unused monies are allocated
 477 under paragraph (a) of this section shall provide an accounting of
 478 such unused monies to the Department of Finance and
 479 Administration.

480 (ii) Monies in the special fund may be used to
 481 reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred by the
 482 Department of Finance and Administration, acting through the
 483 Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property Management, in
 484 administering or providing assistance directly related to a
 485 project described in paragraph (a) of this section. An accounting
 486 of actual costs incurred for which reimbursement is sought shall
 487 be maintained for each project by the Department of Finance and
 488 Administration, Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property

489 Management. Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary
490 costs for a project shall not exceed two percent (2%) of the
491 monies in the special fund used for such project. Monies
492 authorized for a particular project may not be used to reimburse
493 administrative costs for unrelated projects.

494 (c) The Department of Finance and Administration,
495 acting through the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property
496 Management, is expressly authorized and empowered to receive and
497 expend any local or other source funds in connection with the
498 expenditure of funds provided for in this section. The
499 expenditure of monies deposited into the special fund shall be
500 under the direction of the Department of Finance and
501 Administration, and such funds shall be paid by the State
502 Treasurer upon warrants issued by such department, which warrants
503 shall be issued upon requisitions signed by the Executive Director
504 of the Department of Finance and Administration, or his designee.

505 (d) Any amounts allocated to an agency that are in
506 excess of that needed to complete the projects at such agency that
507 are described in paragraph (a) of this section may be used for
508 general repairs and renovations at the agency.

509 **SECTION 23.** (a) (i) A special fund, to be designated the
510 "2022 Department of Finance and Administration Statewide Repair
511 and Renovation Fund," is created within the State Treasury. The
512 fund shall be maintained by the State Treasurer as a separate and
513 special fund, separate and apart from the General Fund of the

514 state. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a
515 fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any
516 interest earned or investment earnings on amounts in the fund
517 shall be deposited into such fund.

518 (ii) Monies deposited into the fund shall be
519 disbursed, in the discretion of the Department of Finance and
520 Administration, to pay the costs of site and infrastructure
521 improvements, general repairs and renovations, weatherization,
522 roofing, environmental mitigation, mechanical, electrical and
523 structural repairs required for state-owned facilities,
524 universities and community and junior colleges, repairs,
525 renovations and improvements necessary for compliance with the
526 Americans with Disabilities Act or other codes, purchase and
527 installation of necessary furniture and equipment, and
528 continuation and completion of previously authorized projects.

529 (b) Amounts deposited into such special fund shall be
530 disbursed to pay the costs of the projects described in paragraph
531 (a) of this section.

532 (c) The Department of Finance and Administration,
533 acting through the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property
534 Management, is expressly authorized and empowered to receive and
535 expend any local or other source funds in connection with the
536 expenditure of funds provided for in this section. The
537 expenditure of monies deposited into the special fund shall be
538 under the direction of the Department of Finance and

539 Administration, and such funds shall be paid by the State
540 Treasurer upon warrants issued by such department, which warrants
541 shall be issued upon requisitions signed by the Executive Director
542 of the Department of Finance and Administration, or his designee.

543 **SECTION 24.** (a) (i) A special fund, to be designated as
544 the "2022 Tate County - Erosion Control and Repair Fund," is
545 created within the State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained
546 by the State Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate
547 and apart from the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts
548 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
549 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment
550 earnings on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into such fund.

551 (ii) Monies deposited into the fund shall be
552 disbursed, in the discretion of the Department of Environmental
553 Quality, to assist Tate County, Mississippi, in paying costs
554 associated with ditch erosion control, repair and rehabilitation
555 along and near the project described in Section 27-104-301(2)(mm),
556 Mississippi Code of 1972, and on property located along and near
557 such project, including, but not limited to, creation of detention
558 areas along ditches, replacement of drainage structures along
559 ditches, rock stabilization at downstream ends of ditches and
560 reestablishing vegetative cover on all disturbed areas.

561 (b) Amounts deposited into such special fund shall be
562 disbursed to pay the costs of the projects described in paragraph
563 (a) of this section.

564 **SECTION 25.** (1) A special fund, to be designated as the
565 "2022 Local Improvements Projects Fund," is created within the
566 State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained by the State
567 Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart from
568 the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining in
569 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the

1588 **SECTION 26.** (1) A special fund is created within the State
1589 Treasury to be used as provided in this section. The fund shall
1590 be maintained by the State Treasurer as a separate and special
1591 fund, separate and apart from the General Fund of the state.
1592 Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal
1593 year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest
1594 earned or investment earnings on amounts in the fund shall be
1595 deposited into such fund.

1596 (2) Monies deposited into the fund shall be disbursed, in
1597 the discretion of the Mississippi Development Authority ("MDA") as
1598 follows:

1599 (i) Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
1600 (\$2,500,000.00) shall be used for the purpose of providing funds
1601 to assist Pinchers Seafood, with support and expansion of its
1602 operations in Mississippi, including, but not limited to, land
1603 acquisition, construction of facilities and dredging. In order to
1604 receive such assistance, Pinchers Seafood must submit an
1605 application to the MDA. The MDA shall review and approve the
1606 projects for which the assistance may be used. If the MDA
1607 approves an application for assistance, it also must use other
1608 available funds from its programs, for which Pinchers Seafood is
1609 eligible to receive assistance, to assist with the completion of
1610 the approved projects.

1611 (ii) Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
1612 (\$2,500,000.00) shall be used for the purpose of providing funds

1613 to assist Halter Marine with support and expansion of its
1614 operations including shoreline power in Mississippi. In order to
1615 receive such assistance, Halter Marine must submit an application
1616 to the MDA. The MDA shall review and approve the projects for
1617 which the assistance may be used. If the MDA approves an
1618 application for assistance, it also must use other available funds
1619 from its programs, for which Halter Marine is eligible to receive
1620 assistance, to assist with the completion of the approved
1621 projects.

1622 (iii) Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
1623 (\$2,500,000.00) shall be used for the purpose of providing funds
1624 to assist Highland Carbon Solutions, LLC, with the establishment
1625 of its operations in Mississippi. In order to receive such
1626 assistance, Highland Carbon Solutions, LLC, must submit an
1627 application to the MDA. The MDA shall review and approve the
1628 projects for which the assistance may be used. If the MDA
1629 approves an application for assistance, it also must use other
1630 available funds from its programs, for which Highland Carbon
1631 Solutions, LLC, is eligible to receive assistance, to assist with
1632 the completion of the approved projects.

1633 **SECTION 27.** Section 39-5-145, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1634 amended as follows:

1635 39-5-145. (1) A special fund, to be designated the
1636 "Mississippi Community Heritage Preservation Grant Fund," is
1637 created within the State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained

1638 by the State Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate
1639 and apart from the General Fund of the state. The fund shall
1640 consist of any monies designated for deposit therein from any
1641 source, including proceeds of any state general obligation bonds
1642 designated for deposit therein. Unexpended amounts remaining in
1643 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the
1644 State General Fund and any interest earned or investment earnings
1645 on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into the fund. The
1646 expenditure of monies deposited into the fund shall be under the
1647 direction of the Department of Finance and Administration, based
1648 upon recommendations of the Board of Trustees of the Department of
1649 Archives and History, and such funds shall be paid by the State
1650 Treasurer upon warrants issued by the Department of Finance and
1651 Administration. Monies deposited into such fund shall be
1652 allocated and disbursed according to the provisions of this
1653 section. If any monies in the special fund are derived from
1654 proceeds of state general obligation bonds and are not used within
1655 four (4) years after the date such bond proceeds are deposited
1656 into the special fund, then the Department of Finance and
1657 Administration shall provide an accounting of such unused monies
1658 to the State Bond Commission.

1659 (2) Monies deposited into the fund shall be allocated and
1660 disbursed as follows:

1661 (a) (i) * * * Fifty-six Million Fifty Thousand Dollars
1662 (\$56,050,000.00) shall be allocated and disbursed as grants on a

1663 reimbursable basis through the Department of Finance and
1664 Administration, based upon the recommendations of the Board of
1665 Trustees of the Department of Archives and History, to assist
1666 county governments, municipal governments, school districts,
1667 universities, community colleges, state agencies and nonprofit
1668 organizations that have obtained Section 501(c)(3) tax-exempt
1669 status from the United States Internal Revenue Service in helping
1670 pay the costs incurred in preserving, restoring, rehabilitating,
1671 repairing or interpreting 1. historic county courthouses, 2.
1672 historic school buildings, and/or 3. other historic properties
1673 identified by certified local governments. Where possible,
1674 expenditures from the fund shall be used to match federal grants
1675 or other grants that may be accessed by the Department of Archives
1676 and History, other state agencies, county governments or municipal
1677 governments, school districts or nonprofit organizations that have
1678 obtained Section 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status from the United
1679 States Internal Revenue Service. Any properties, except those
1680 described in paragraphs (b) and (d) of this subsection, receiving
1681 monies pursuant to this section must be designated as "Mississippi
1682 Landmark" properties prior to selection as projects for funding
1683 under the provisions of this section.

1684 (ii) One Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand
1685 Dollars (\$1,750,000.00) shall be allocated and disbursed as grants
1686 through the Department of Finance and Administration, based upon
1687 the recommendations of the Board of Trustees of the Department of

1688 Archives and History, to assist county governments in helping pay
1689 the costs of historically appropriate restoration, repair and
1690 renovation of historically significant county courthouses. Grants
1691 to individual courthouses under this paragraph (a)(ii) shall not
1692 exceed Eight Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$875,000.00).

1693 (b) Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00)
1694 shall be allocated and disbursed as grant funds to the Amory
1695 Regional Museum in Amory, Mississippi, to pay the costs of capital
1696 improvements, repair, renovation, furnishing and/or equipping of
1697 the museum. The Department of Finance and Administration is
1698 directed to transfer Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
1699 (\$250,000.00) from the fund to the city on or before December 31,
1700 2004, and the city shall place the funds into an escrow account.
1701 The city may expend the funds from the account only in an amount
1702 equal to matching funds that are provided from any source other
1703 than the state for the project. As the funds are withdrawn from
1704 the escrow account, the city shall certify to the Department of
1705 Finance and Administration the amount of the funds that have been
1706 withdrawn and that the funds withdrawn are in an amount equal to
1707 matching funds required by this paragraph.

1708 (c) One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be
1709 allocated and disbursed as grant funds to the Jacinto Foundation,
1710 Inc., to pay the costs of capital improvements, repairing,
1711 renovating, restoring, rehabilitating, preserving, furnishing
1712 and/or equipping the courthouse and related facilities in Jacinto,

1713 Mississippi, and to pay the costs of capital improvements,
1714 repairing, renovating, restoring, rehabilitating, preserving,
1715 furnishing and/or equipping other buildings and facilities near
1716 the courthouse.

1717 (d) Four Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Dollars
1718 (\$425,000.00) shall be allocated and disbursed as grant funds to
1719 the Oxford-Lafayette County Heritage Foundation to pay the costs
1720 of capital improvements, repairing, renovating, restoring,
1721 rehabilitating, preserving, furnishing, equipping and/or acquiring
1722 the L.Q.C. Lamar Home in Oxford, Mississippi.

1723 (e) One Million Four Hundred Twenty-five Thousand
1724 Dollars (\$1,425,000.00) shall be allocated and disbursed as grant
1725 funds to the City of Columbus, Mississippi, to assist in paying
1726 the costs associated with repair, renovation and restoration of
1727 the Columbus City Hall building and related facilities.

1728 (f) One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall be
1729 allocated and disbursed as grant funds to the Town of Wesson,
1730 Mississippi, to pay the costs of restoration and renovation of the
1731 Old Wesson School.

1732 (g) Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00)
1733 shall be allocated and disbursed as grant funds to the Town of
1734 Shubuta, Mississippi, to assist in paying the costs associated
1735 with construction, reconstruction, refurbishing, repair,
1736 renovation and restoration of the Shubuta Town Hall building and
1737 related facilities.

1738 (h) Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00)
1739 shall be allocated and disbursed as grant funds to the City of
1740 Okolona, Mississippi, to assist in paying costs associated with
1741 the purchase, repair, renovation, furnishing and equipping of a
1742 building and related facilities on Main Street in the City of
1743 Okolona, for the purpose of establishing a welcome center in which
1744 historical information relating to the City of Okolona will be
1745 displayed, including, but not limited to, information relating to
1746 the furniture, banking, retail and farming industries; education;
1747 historical collections owned by individuals and organizations;
1748 genealogy; Okolona College; and the Battle of Okolona and the War
1749 Between the States.

1750 (i) One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be
1751 allocated and disbursed as grant funds to Tallahatchie County,
1752 Mississippi, to assist in paying the costs associated with repair,
1753 renovation and restoration of the Tallahatchie County Courthouse.

1754 (j) Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00)
1755 shall be allocated and disbursed as grant funds to Wayne County,
1756 Mississippi, to assist in paying the costs associated with repair,
1757 renovation and restoration of the Wayne County Courthouse.

1758 (k) Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) shall
1759 be allocated and disbursed as grant funds to assist in paying the
1760 cost of rehabilitation and restoration of Winterville Indian
1761 Mounds in Washington County, Mississippi.

1762 (1) Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) shall
1763 be allocated and disbursed as grant funds to the City of
1764 Kosciusko, to assist the City of Kosciusko, Mississippi, in paying
1765 costs associated with (i) repair, renovation, furnishing,
1766 equipping, additions to and expansion of the Kosciusko Natchez
1767 Trace Visitor Center in the City of Kosciusko, Mississippi, and
1768 (ii) repair, renovation, furnishing, equipping, additions to and
1769 expansion of the historic Strand Theater in the City of Kosciusko,
1770 Mississippi.

1771 (m) One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be
1772 allocated and disbursed as grant funds to Jefferson County,
1773 Mississippi, to assist in paying costs associated with repair,
1774 renovation, upgrades and improvements to the confederate cemetery
1775 and related properties and facilities in the county.

1776 (n) Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) shall
1777 be allocated and disbursed as grant funds to Tate County,
1778 Mississippi, to assist in paying costs associated with painting,
1779 refurbishment and historical restoration and renovation of the
1780 Tate County Courthouse.

1781 (o) Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) shall
1782 be allocated and disbursed as grant funds to Humphreys County,
1783 Mississippi, to assist in paying costs associated with repair and
1784 renovation of and upgrades and improvements to the Humphreys
1785 County Courthouse.

1786 (p) One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) of
1787 any monies deposited into the fund during Fiscal Year 2023 shall
1788 be allocated and disbursed as grant funds to assist in paying the
1789 costs associated with relocation, repair, renovation and
1790 restoration of a one-room school building and related facilities
1791 including costs incurred before July 1, 2022, and such grant funds
1792 shall not be subject to any requirement for matching funds.

1793 (* * *g) Monies in the Mississippi Community Heritage
1794 Preservation Grant Fund which are derived from proceeds of state
1795 general obligation bonds may be used to reimburse reasonable
1796 actual and necessary costs incurred by the Mississippi Department
1797 of Archives and History in providing assistance directly related
1798 to a project described in paragraph (a) of this subsection for
1799 which funding is provided under this section. Reimbursement may
1800 be made only until such time as the project is completed. An
1801 accounting of actual costs incurred for which reimbursement is
1802 sought shall be maintained for each project by the Mississippi
1803 Department of Archives and History. Reimbursement of reasonable
1804 actual and necessary costs for a project shall not exceed three
1805 percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued for such project.
1806 Monies authorized for a particular project may not be used to
1807 reimburse administrative costs for unrelated projects.

1808 (3) (a) The Board of Trustees of the Department of Archives
1809 and History shall receive and consider proposals from county
1810 governments, municipal governments, school districts,

1811 universities, community colleges, state agencies and nonprofit
1812 organizations that have obtained Section 501(c)(3) tax-exempt
1813 status from the United States Internal Revenue Service for
1814 projects associated with the preservation, restoration,
1815 rehabilitation, repair or interpretation of (i) historic
1816 courthouses, (ii) historic school buildings, and/or (iii) other
1817 historic properties identified by certified local governments.
1818 Proposals shall be submitted in accordance with the provisions of
1819 procedures, criteria and standards developed by the board. The
1820 board shall determine those projects to be funded and may require
1821 matching funds from any applicant seeking assistance under this
1822 section. This subsection shall not apply to projects described in
1823 subsection (2)(a)(ii), (2)(b), (2)(c), (2)(d), (2)(e), (2)(f),
1824 (2)(g), (2)(h) and (2)(j) of this section.

1825 (b) The Board of Trustees of the Department of Archives
1826 and History shall receive and consider proposals from county
1827 governments for projects associated with historically appropriate
1828 restoration, repair and renovation of historically significant
1829 county courthouses. Proposals shall be submitted in accordance
1830 with the provisions of procedures, criteria and standards
1831 developed by the board. The board shall determine those projects
1832 to be funded and may require matching funds from any applicant
1833 seeking assistance under this section. This subsection shall not
1834 apply to projects described in subsection (2)(a)(i), (2)(b),
1835 (2)(c), (2)(d), (2)(e) and (2)(f) of this section.

1836 (4) The Department of Archives and History shall publicize
1837 the Community Heritage Preservation Grant Program described in
1838 this section on a statewide basis, including the publication of
1839 the criteria and standards used by the department in selecting
1840 projects for funding. The selection of a project for funding
1841 under the provisions of this section shall be made solely upon the
1842 deliberate consideration of each proposed project on its merits.
1843 The board shall make every effort to award the grants in a manner
1844 that will fairly distribute the funds in regard to the geography
1845 and cultural diversity of the state. This subsection shall not
1846 apply to projects described in subsection (2) (b), (2) (c), (2) (d),
1847 (2) (e) and (2) (f) of this section.

1848 (5) With regard to any project awarded funding under this
1849 section, any consultant, planner, architect, engineer, exhibit
1850 contracting firm, historic preservation specialist or other
1851 professional hired by a grant recipient to work on any such
1852 project shall be approved by the board before their employment by
1853 the grant recipient.

1854 (6) Plans and specifications for all projects initiated
1855 under the provisions of this section shall be approved by the
1856 board before the awarding of any contracts. The plans and
1857 specifications for any work involving "Mississippi Landmark"
1858 properties shall be developed in accordance with "The Secretary of
1859 the Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic
1860 Properties."

1861 **SECTION 28.** Section 39-11-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1862 amended as follows:

1863 39-11-13. (1) (a) A special fund, to be designated as the
1864 "Building Fund for the Arts," is created within the State
1865 Treasury. The fund shall be maintained by the State Treasurer as
1866 a separate and special fund, separate and apart from the General
1867 Fund of the state. The fund shall consist of any money designated
1868 for deposit therein from any source, including, but not limited
1869 to, any state general obligation bonds issued for the purposes
1870 described in this section. Unexpended amounts remaining in the
1871 fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State
1872 General Fund, and investment earnings on amounts in the fund shall
1873 be deposited into such fund.

1874 (b) Money deposited into the fund shall be disbursed,
1875 in the discretion of the Mississippi Arts Commission, to provide
1876 grants to nonprofit organizations that are qualified as tax exempt
1877 under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and units of
1878 local government to pay the costs of:

1879 (i) Repair, upgrading, expansion, renovation or
1880 enhancement of existing buildings and facilities for the
1881 presentation, teaching or exhibition of the arts in any and all of
1882 its forms and furniture, equipment and/or technology for such
1883 buildings or facilities;

1884 (ii) Construction of new buildings and facilities
1885 for the presentation, teaching or exhibition of the arts in any

1886 and all of its forms and furniture, equipment and/or technology
1887 for such buildings or facilities; or

1888 (iii) The development, construction, equipping and
1889 furnishing of an entertainment and film center and museum and
1890 completion of a sound stage project.

1891 Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) of any monies
1892 deposited into the fund during Fiscal Year 2023 shall be used to
1893 provide grant funds for the establishment of a band and music
1894 program for a nonprofit organization in this state that is
1895 qualified as exempt from federal income taxation under Section
1896 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

1897 (c) The entity to which such grants are made shall
1898 provide matching funds from local, federal or private sources
1899 equal to forty percent (40%) of the proposed project cost in order
1900 to be eligible for a grant under this section.

1901 (d) The maximum aggregate amount of monies in the
1902 special fund that may be used to provide grant funds to an entity
1903 or combination of entities under paragraph (b) (iii) of this
1904 subsection shall not exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00),
1905 and no monies in the special fund may be used to provide grant
1906 funds under paragraph (b) (iii) of this subsection after July 1,
1907 2003. The maximum aggregate amount of grant funds that may be
1908 provided to an entity or combination of entities under paragraph
1909 (b) (iii) of this subsection during a fiscal year shall not exceed
1910 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00).

1911 (2) (a) Amounts deposited into such special fund shall be
1912 disbursed to pay the costs of projects described in subsection (1)
1913 of this section. If any monies in the special fund are derived
1914 from proceeds of bonds issued under Sections 3 through 18 of
1915 Chapter 541, Laws of 2001, as amended by Chapter 540, Laws of
1916 2002, as amended by Chapter 519, Laws of 2003, as amended by
1917 Chapter 1, Laws of 2004 Third Extraordinary Session, as amended by
1918 Chapter 538, Laws of 2006, as amended by Section 1 of Chapter 607,
1919 Laws of 2007, and are not used within four (4) years after the
1920 date such bond proceeds are deposited into the special fund, then
1921 the Mississippi Arts Commission shall provide an accounting of
1922 such unused monies to the State Bond Commission.

1923 (b) [Repealed]

1924 (3) The Mississippi Arts Commission is expressly authorized
1925 and empowered to receive and expend any local or other source
1926 funds in connection with the expenditure of funds provided for in
1927 this section. The expenditure of money deposited into the special
1928 fund shall be under the direction of the Mississippi Arts
1929 Commission, and such funds shall be paid by the State Treasurer
1930 upon warrants issued by the Department of Finance and
1931 Administration upon request of the Mississippi Arts Commission,
1932 which warrants shall be issued upon requisitions signed by the
1933 Executive Director of the Mississippi Arts Commission, or his or
1934 her designee.

1935 (4) The Mississippi Arts Commission shall adopt necessary
1936 rules and regulations to govern the administration of the program
1937 described in subsection (1) of this section, including, but not
1938 limited to, rules and regulations governing applications for
1939 grants and rules and regulations providing for the distribution of
1940 grant funds. The Mississippi Arts Commission shall comply with
1941 the provisions of the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law.

1942 **SECTION 29.** Section 57-1-701, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

1944 57-1-701. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
1945 following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed in
1946 this subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

1947 (a) "Eligible entity" means any (i) county, (ii)
1948 municipality or (iii) public or private nonprofit local economic
1949 development entity including, but not limited to, local
1950 authorities, commissions, or other entities created by local and
1951 private legislation or pursuant to Section 19-5-99.

1952 (b) "Optioned property" means industrial property that
1953 is subject to a real estate option to purchase contract entered
1954 into between an eligible entity and a real estate owner, where
1955 such option shall be for a minimum of three (3) years and the
1956 option price shall not exceed the appraised fair market value of
1957 the real estate.

1958 (* * *c) "Eligible expenditures" means:

1959 (i) Fees for architects, engineers, environmental
1960 consultants, attorneys, and such other advisors, consultants and
1961 agents that MDA determines are necessary to complete site due
1962 diligence associated with site development improvements located on
1963 industrial property that is publicly owned or is optioned
1964 property; * * *

1965 (ii) Contributions toward site development
1966 improvements, as approved by MDA, located on industrial property
1967 that is publicly owned * * *;

1968 (iii) Contributions toward public infrastructure
1969 improvements directly serving industrial property that is publicly
1970 owned or is optioned property; and/or

1971 (iv) Contributions toward acquisition of publicly
1972 owned real property used for economic development purposes by an
1973 eligible entity, where the acquisition price shall not exceed the
1974 appraised fair market value of the property.

1975 (* * *d) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development
1976 Authority.

1977 (* * *e) "Site development improvements" means site
1978 clearing, grading, and environmental mitigation; improvements to
1979 drainage systems; easement and right-of-way acquisition; sewer
1980 systems; transportation directly affecting the site, including
1981 roads, bridges or rail; bulkheads; taxiways and parking ramps;
1982 land reclamation; water supply (storage, treatment and
1983 distribution); telecommunications systems, including fiber optic;

1984 natural gas distribution systems; aesthetic improvements; the
1985 dredging of channels and basins; or other improvements as approved
1986 by MDA.

1987 (2) (a) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
1988 special fund to be designated as the "Mississippi Site Development
1989 Grant Fund," which shall consist of funds made available by the
1990 Legislature in any manner and funds from any other source
1991 designated for deposit into such fund. Unexpended amounts
1992 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1993 into the State General Fund, and any investment earnings or
1994 interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the
1995 credit of the fund. Monies in the fund shall be used to make
1996 grants to assist eligible entities as provided in this section.

1997 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from proceeds
1998 of bonds issued under Section 2 of Chapter 390, Laws of 2017,
1999 Section 5 of Chapter 412, Laws of 2018, Section 1 of Chapter 421,
2000 Laws of 2019, Section 4 of Chapter 492, Laws of 2020, or Section 8
2001 of Chapter 480, Laws of 2021, may be used to reimburse reasonable
2002 actual and necessary costs incurred by MDA for the administration
2003 of the various grant, loan and financial incentive programs
2004 administered by MDA. An accounting of actual costs incurred for
2005 which reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by MDA.
2006 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not
2007 exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued.

2008 Reimbursements under this subsection shall satisfy any applicable
2009 federal tax law requirements.

2010 (3) (a) MDA shall establish a program to make grants to
2011 eligible entities to match local or other funds associated with
2012 improving the marketability of publicly owned industrial property
2013 for industrial economic development purposes and other property
2014 improvements as approved by MDA. An eligible entity may apply to
2015 MDA for a grant under this program in the manner provided for in
2016 this section. An eligible entity desiring assistance under this
2017 section must provide matching funds in an amount determined by
2018 MDA. Matching funds may be provided in the form of cash and/or
2019 in-kind services as determined by MDA.

2020 (b) An eligible entity desiring assistance under this
2021 section must submit an application to MDA. The application must
2022 include:

2023 (i) A description of the eligible expenditures for
2024 which assistance is requested;

2025 (ii) The amount of assistance requested;

2026 (iii) The amount and type of matching funds to be
2027 provided by the eligible entity; and

2028 (iv) Any other information required by MDA.

2029 (c) Upon request by MDA, an eligible entity shall
2030 provide MDA with access to all studies, reports, documents and/or
2031 plans developed as a result of or related to an eligible entity
2032 receiving assistance under this section.

2033 (4) MDA shall have all powers necessary to implement and
2034 administer the program established under this section, and the
2035 department shall promulgate rules and regulations, in accordance
2036 with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, necessary for
2037 the implementation of this section.

2038 (5) MDA shall file an annual report with the Governor, the
2039 Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of
2040 Representatives not later than December 1 of each year, describing
2041 all assistance provided under this section.

2042 **SECTION 30.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
2043 and after July 1, 2022.
