



The COVID-19 pandemic has changed the way healthcare workers take care of our patients and our employees. Protecting our staff and our patients is a priority!






In an effort to decrease the spread of COVID-19 and Flu, Neshoba General continues to take extra steps to protect our patients, staff, visitors and community.
